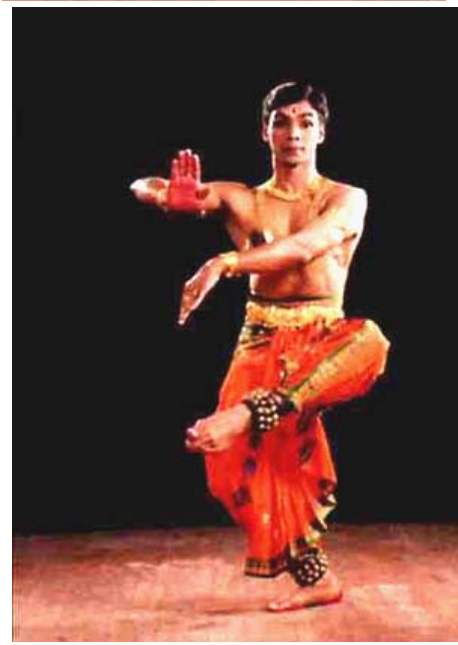
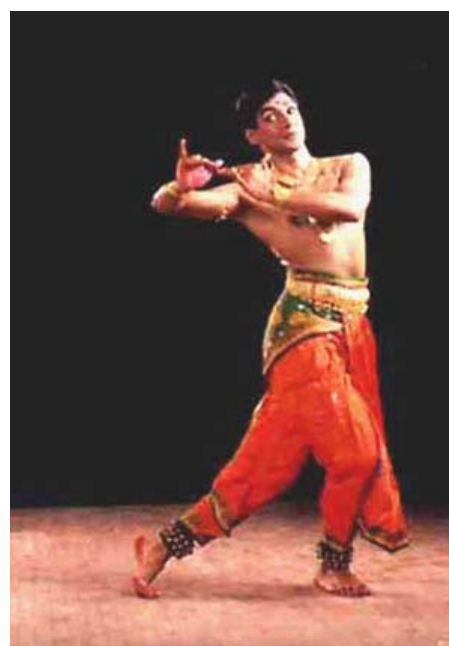

The feminine man who performs these dance steps is nothing less than a Catholic priest.

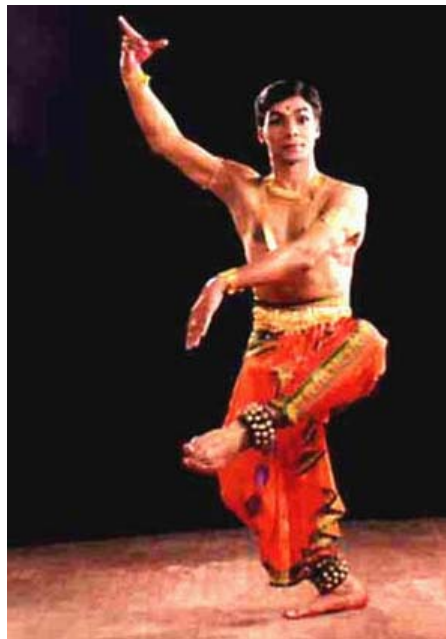
He is a Jesuit from India, Fr. Saju George.

who also praises the innovations.

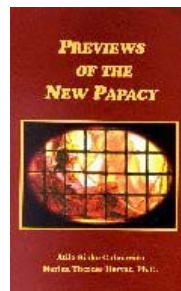
